

Dark and Sexy: For some of us, seeing American Gigolo in 1980 introduced us to Richard Gere. The film remains a love affair to his finely honed body, great wardrobe, hot cars, and music of Blondie. Today's American Gigolo on Showtime uses the same characters created by Paul Schrader and explores their histories and motivations. Jon Bernthal is the male hustler this time, with Rosie O'Donnell playing a featured role as a detective. It is worth the time if you like cop dramas.

Family Films: If you will watch films with kids or grandkids this holiday season, I enjoyed two films set in the Middle Ages with very light gay touches, but nothing overt. **Rosaline** is a new Hulu comedy about the woman Romeo jilted. If you love the original R & J, you may find yourself smiling at the sassy writing, the very gay Paris, and the extremely hunky leading man Sean Teale. Minnie Driver is also featured. A second film, **Catherine Called Birdy**, is a fun look at teenage empowerment as Birdy fights to live the life she chooses. Lena Dunham makes it all feel fresh and fun. Look for it on Amazon.

Keep it Gay: Did you enjoy the gay films at Reeling and Chicago Film Fest? A new fest is the Pride Film Fest of which I am the director. You can stream the six programs of shorts and features from anywhere. The films are by emerging filmmakers and cover the whole spectrum of queer communities. A new program streams each Wednesday, now through December 11. Finally, Black Alphabet Film Fest is November 5 and 6 at the Logan Center at U of C, and they have films slated from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm both days. I am not sure if all of them are LGBTQ, but the company and facility are great. They also have an excellent list of <u>queer black films</u> on the website.



Frank graduated from Saint Rita High School in 1953 and enlisted in the US Army, who stationed him at Fort Leonard Wood in Missouri.


Frank was a witty, structured, routine person who always had the last jab. He loved receiving and giving kisses and hugs.

Larry L. has offered to host a book discussion on The Kingdom of Sand (258 pgs.) by Andrew Holleran, author of *Dancer from the Dance*. The discussion will be held at Larry's apartment in Chicago's Edgewater neighborhood.



In this tale of desire and dread, the nameless narrator is a gay man who moved to Florida to care for his aging parents during the height of the AIDS epidemic and never left. He chronicles the indignities and loneliness of growing old in a small town. His one friendship is with Earl, an older gay man he met twenty years previously while cruising the boat ramp. They meet weekly to watch classic films and critique the neighbors. Now

Earl's health is failing. Our narrator must face that after Earl dies, he will be completely alone with only sexual encounters at the video porn store and visits to Walgreens. His reflections on illness and death are at once funny and heartbreaking.

The term "homosexual" was first coined in Europe in 1869. Before then same-sex behavior was hidden. Now same-sex desire was viewed as the basis for a new identity category. Artists portrayed this new identity in their work. Twenty-three international scholars selected 100 artworks, many by major artists, for this exhibition. Some works have never left their home countries and private collections before.

Gallery 659 will open on a day they are normally closed: Thursday, December 8, at 12:30 p.m., for members of the Greater Chicago Chapter of the Victorian Society, Chicago Prime Timers, and Mensa's Rainbow SIG. Cost per ticket is \$15.

The meeting was called to order an 7:10 P.M. The Agenda was approved by consensus. Approval of Minutes of 12 September was moved

by Larry and seconded by Marvin. The motion passed unanimously.
