



Shortest Way Home by Pete Buttigieg

Written in 2019 when Buttigieg was age 37 and mayor of South Bend, Indiana, the book interweaves two narratives, that of a young gay male Episcopalian coming of age and the tale of a Rust Belt industrial city regaining its economic vitality. Buttigieg attracted national attention and respect when he ran

for president. He sits in President Biden's cabinet as the Secretary of Transportation.




