Pete Buttigieg, Secretary of Transportation and former presidential candidate, wrote an inspiring personal memoir, *Shortest Way Home*. Elected mayor of



South Bend, Indiana, when he was 29, his job was interrupted when he was called to serve as a Naval officer in Afghanistan. He weaves together two narratives, that of a young gay man coming of age and later marrying his husband plus a second narrative of a midwestern mid-size city regaining its economic vitality. His analysis of our political parties and government leaders is masterful. Buttigieg champions personal, family, and professional values and encourages public service, all delivered with humor and hope.

Join us to discuss the book along with members of a gay book club, Rainbow Mensa, and Queers at Atonement.


